STATE MUSEUMS  
AND MONUMENTS

**1 First Tower (Rocca or Guaita) - Salita alla Rocca**  
First Tower built in the 11th century and subsequently renovated. Left of entrance is situated the fortress chapel, consecrated to Saint Barbara.

**2 Second Tower (Cesta or Fratta) - Salita alla Cesta**  
Second Tower, dating back to the 13th century. It is situated on the highest peak of Mount Titano (750 m.a.s.l.). The tower lodges the Museum of Ancient Weapons which dates back to the 15th - 18th century.

**9 Public Palace - Piazza della Libertà**  
The Public Palace is the seat of San Marino supreme institution. The Council room can be visited only when no sittings of the Great and General Council (Parliament) take place. The Changing of the Guard ceremony takes place in the summertime.

**14 State Museum - Piazza Titano - Palazzo Pergami**  
It gathers archaeological and artistic artefacts related to the legend of the founder Saint, the history of the Republic and its institutions.

**19 St. Francis Museum - Art Gallery - Via Basiliculus**  
It is located inside the cloister of St. Francis church, which was built in 1361 by Comacini Master Craftsmen. It contains an important collection of frescoes and paintings.

**4 Basilica of Saint Marinus**  
Built in the early 19th century on the foundations of the existing Romanesque church. It contains valuable statues and paintings. Free admission.

**35 Coin and Stamp Museum**  
A journey that tells the history of the Republic from the second half of the 19th century to today through philatelic issues and numismatics.

**33 San Marino National Gallery**  
Headquartered at the Loggia dei Volontari (Volunteers' Loggia), a wonderful building erected in the 1930s, this Gallery hosts over 1,000 works by some of the most renowned artists of the 20th century, from Guttuso to Vedova, from Chia to Cucchi.



It is recommended to wear **comfortable shoes**. **Warning!** Some places along the route may be **dangerous**.
